ATKV DRAKENSVILLE - RALLY REPORT

5 - 12 MARCH 2023



Just over three hours' drive from Johannesburg and Bloemfontein you will find the ATKV Drakensville holiday resort near the foothills of the Drakensberg Amphitheatre, a world heritage site. There are breathtaking views and Drakensville is surrounded by historical landmarks.

The resort has outside warm and cold pools and an inside warm pool, recreational facilities plus a restaurant, fast-food outlet, coffee shop and gift shop. There is outside chess and putt-putt available.

95 motorhomes registered to attend the Northern Convergence. This is a record number of motorhomes that entered for the rally. We had to asked members to double up at stands. 
BINGO EVENING
